There is no question, this nation has become more and more divided during the past three years. This did not begin with the election of Donald J Trump as president, but it has certainly escalated under his administration.



problem among street comer and group filled Churches is the problem of getting along with one another. Every church believer has enough of the human nature in them to divide and wreck any church. Only as empowered by the Holy Spirit can we develop the love-forbearance- kindness and forgiveness that are indispensable for peace. God admonishes us again, in Romans 14: 19, "Let us therefore follow after the things which make for Peace, and things wherewith one may edify another."

We should make every effort to maintain peace and harmony in every thing we do. We should strive to build up others in God's most holy faith. God is doing a work in the life of each one of us, It is for that reason we should be characterized as having lives of practical righteousness by dispositions of peace and harmony. We are to have a mind—set on joy in the Holy Spirit, by having the fruits of the Holy Spirit active in our lives.

God intends that we fight! But He does not want us to fight other people and especially not His own called brethren. God wants us to take note of Paul letter in Eph 6:10-12. He begins with "Finally" My brethren." Finally may be rendered, from now on, or henceforth. Our spiritual battle is from now on until the Lord returns. Eph 6: verse 10, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armour of God, that you may be able to Stand against the wiles of the devil. For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against Principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against wicked spirits in high places!" (Eph. 6:10-12).

We have enemies, vicious, clever, murderous enemies. They are spirit beings, demons who are fighting us on a spiritual front. They are assaulting us, causing doubt, division, and discouragement.

not on our own strength. We have to put on the whole armor of God He supplies the tools and means for us to battle against the devil and his demons.

The day we were baptized, the enemy Satan and his army of demons set out to kill us spiritually. They are relentless in this pursuit. Therefore God admonishes us to use His protective armor and to fight! The weapons of God's warfare are seen in Eph 6, "Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of Peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the spirit, which is the Word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints" (Eph 6:14-18). One of our most powerful weapons is the sword God has given us. That is the Word of God. The truth and understanding of God's ways. Besides all this as Christ called, we must pray for one another and help one another in this all-out struggle for eternal life.

Looking now to the second battle front: Up to this point we know the devil is our enemy. We have to fight him and the demons. In Romans 12: 2 we read, 'Be not conformed to this world: but be you transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." We are to notice! Christians are to keep from being conformed to this world. And that's not easy to do! The society around us and its worldly attitude on ways of doing things, its trends, styles, government policies ideologies, religious and educational philosophies — Are all lumped into one gigantic "pressure cooker" which the Bible refers to as "this world." The world is like a gigantic press trying to squeeze us, conform us into its patterns.

God's called are told, "Come out of her, My people" (Rev. 18:4). There is only one way for us to keep from being crushed and conformed by this world. We have to fight for it! Satan's world never' ceases in pressuring us into going and doing the wrong ways. It is continually reaches out for you and me. Its constantly putting pressure on us through the media of television, radio, advertisements, books, magazines, and associations with other people. Satan's sinful world is also reaching out to influence our children.

We need to fight for our family as well as for our own life! There is a war going on, a war in which we can be made a slave. If we don't fight, we will not win.

Looking now at the third battle front: We not only have to fight the devil and his demons, but fight to resist the pulls and pressures of this world and its loose ways, we also have to fight another very powerful and insidious enemy. That enemy is your own human nature!



This is how the Apostle Paul describes this third warring enemy. "I find then a law [a working principle], that, when I would do good, evil is present with me. For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: but I see another law in my members, warring against the law in my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members" (Romans 7:21-23).

There is a war going on inside every called out one. A fight against human nature! Human nature resists us in our efforts to do good. It is a pull in the opposite direction, trying to pull us into the way of sin - warring against our being called! Paul further explains this battle in Galatians 5: 17, "For the flesh lusts against the spirit, and the spirit against the flesh: and these [two] are contrary the one to the other: so that you cannot [it is difficult to] do the things that you would."

When we were called and being worked with, we received some of God's Holy Spirit. That spirit imparted to us the divine nature of God. But we are still flesh. And we are still human. We are still filled with some nature of man called — human nature. The Holy Spirit and the flesh are contrary-enmity is constantly present. There is an antagonism between the things of God and the things of the flesh. They actually thrust themselves one against the other. In other words, there is a constant war going on Our human nature never gives up, pulling on us trying to maintain our bondage to sin and our divine nature leading showing the way through the laws of God. We must fight our

human nature! We must resist the pulls of the flesh! And it is a daily battle.

But there is some good news! Lets now check out the principles of warfare. The day we were baptized we were drafted into a war — a spiritual war. On that day God made available to us the equipment with which to fight on the three battle fronts, the demons, the world, and our human nature—the war started! But it is difficult for us to recognize that we are truly in a war and we to often fail to conduct ourselves like the called soldiers we should be. God gives important principles for his soldiers. Notice what II Tim 2: 3 says, "Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ." Here is one of the first principles a soldier must learn. He must be willing to "endure hardness." Look at our men in war with their battle uniform on. They have to be willing to slosh through mud, endure desert heat, fight insects and jungle rot, and put up with uncomfortable sleeping conditions and canned food.

What if a soldier had the attitude? "I'll fight for my country if I can have my three hot meals a day, sleep on a box spring and mattress, sit by a warm fire and stuffed easy chair at night. and I don't mind the unpleasant shooting as long as it's not in the rain or under muddy conditions and, I can't stand blood, nor can I afford to miss my favorite TV programs on Sunday night! Such statements are laughable, when you think of them coming from a soldier. But what about our-self? are we willing to endure hardness? or do we say, 'I'm willing to be a soldier for Christ, as long as everything goes all right?" As a soldier of Jesus Christ we must be willing to endure hardness, go

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through trials and still keep fighting the enemy. We must recognize that there will be obstacles to hurdle, problems to overcome. But the question is—are we made for this! YES! With God's help we can conquer!

Observe another principle in warfare found in II Tim. 2:4. "No one engaged in warfare entangles himself with the affairs of this life, that he may please Him who enlisted him as a soldier." Since the devil knows this principle of warfare, it is his purpose to see to it that we become concerned with the affairs of this life. He would like to see us bog down - getting our minds on our finances, our relatives, or some little problems. Satan would love to see us relaxing in our

fight for eternal life. We can't get our minds off the warfare and onto the affairs of this life, or we will surely be eliminated! *Reward goes to the winners!*



In the churches of God we hear a lot a b o u t overcoming. But do we get the real meaning of this term? Both the Greek word used in the New

Testament and the English word "overcome," used in the Old Testament means "to conquer." Now notice Jesus Christ's statement in Revelation 2:26. "And he that overcomes [conquers, subdues], and keeps My Works unto the end, to him will I give power over the nations." Who gets power over the nations? Who will rule with Christ in His Kingdom? Who receives the prize? Does it go to the losers? NO! "To him that overcomes will I grant to sit with Me in My Throne, even as I also overcame [conquered], and am set down with My Father in His throne" (Rev. 3:21).

Who gets to sit with Christ on His throne? To whom does this reward go to? It goes to the conquerors the ones who win in this spiritual warfare. Have you ever seen a boxing match, wrestling match, football game, basket ball game or other sporting event, where the cup or, prize or crown went to the loser? Losers just don't win! If we lose in this fight, it will mean that we have been conquered by Satan and the demons! Christ makes a statement in Revelation 21: 7, that we need to pay attention to! "He that over-comes [conquers, wins] shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be My son" (Rev 21: 7). Note the prize, the grand prize goes to the conquerors. This inheritance of all things is a joint inheritance with Jesus the Christ, who is the great conqueror! Jesus Christ was the greatest warrior that ever lived, He met Satan the devil on a spiritual battle front, unparalleled in history. He conquered, and went up against His own human nature time and again and came out the victor every time. He resisted this world, fighting against its pressures all of His life. He was victorious! But He did none of these things on His own strength. He Himself said that by Himself and of Himself, He could do nothing in John 5:30. He knew that He had to have God's instruments of warfare and God's help. This

same help is available to us, you and me. But we must recognize we are in a war. We must recognize it is a fight for eternal life and the reward goes to the winners. Losers get nothing.

Today our battle front is on a spiritual plane, as described earlier. But it is interesting to note that all of God's great men were warriors. Some of them were fighters on a physical plane, but they also had to fight the spiritual fight of faith. Joshua had to fight his way into the land of Canaan. David had to fight in order to preserve his kingdom. Samson fought. Even Abraham was a fighter (Gen. 14:15) tells us, "And he [Abraham] divided himself against them, he and his servants, by night, and smote them, and pursued them unto Hobah," Notice verse 20, here in Genesis 14, `And blessed be the most High God, which has delivered your enemies into your [Abraham] hand." God put Abraham's enemy's into his hands!

But God has called us, not to fight other human beings, but to fight the spiritual fight of faith. And how do we get into God's kingdom? Do we fall in? Do we slide in? Read with me Matt 11: 12, "And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of Heaven suffers violence [margin: is gotten by force] and the violent take it by force [or, it is gotten by men of driving force]."

Read the comment from the Expository Dictionary on this verse. "Those who are possessed ofeagerness and zeal, instead of giving up to the opposition, press their way into the kingdom." We should see it is a fight, a press, a driving effort to get into God's kingdom! God made man to conquer. Even a noted psychologist understands this about human nature. He said, "We humans are engineered as goal-seeking instruments. "We are just built that way. When we have no personal goal that means something to us, we are apt to find life itself purposeless. We are built to conquer the environment, solve problems and achieve goals and, we find no real happiness or satisfaction in life without doing this. People who say that life is not worthwhile are really saying that they themselves have no personal goals that are worthwhile."

Man loves things that are challenging - things he must over come. Notice sports! Would people go hunting, if all animals were tame? Would golfing be interesting if every swing were a hole-in-one? NO, We are attracted by the adventure of accomplishment -the adventure of overcoming the challenge it brings. Right

or wrong — human beings are going to fight Man has a fighting nature. He will fight something and if a person is not fighting for the right things, he ends up fighting with other people. Take, for example, people who are lonely and have no hobbies or outside interests. What do they do? In most cases they end up minding other peoples' business, causing problems through gossip and envy. Since they have no other worthwhile goals, they turn inward and **become bitter** and want to fight their fellow-man.

There are millions of such unhappy souls in this world. Their human nature cries out for something to conquer. But they don't know what to fight for or what to conquer. We are designed by God to conquer and to overcome our human nature. But we must win the fight against our natures pull! We are pitted against the devil and his demons and we must come out the victor! The world is pressing us -trying to conform us to its unholy patterns and we must resist! We are to be driven intense, and forceful when it comes to overcoming these obstacles!

We are to be loving, kind, patient and understanding with other people. These are the fruits of God's Holy Spirit. Notice Paul's statement in 2 Tim.4 shortly before his death. "For 1 am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure Is at hand. 1 have fought a good fight, 1 have finished my course, I have Kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the Righteous Judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love His appearing" (II Tim. 4:6-8).

Paul described his life as a Christian fighter, a conquer! He did not say, "I have lived a good life."He said, "I have fought a good fight." He had won. He had conquered. and he knew there was a crown in store for him, as well as for all others, who fight the good fight and keep the faith.

Paul acknowledges that the law is spiritual—that is, Holy in itself and adapted to man's spiritual benefits. Read what Paul said in Romans 7.

"For we know that the law is spiritual: but I am carnal, sold under sin. For that which I do I allow not: for what I would, that do I not; but what I hate, that do I. If then I do that which I would not, I consent unto the law that it is good. Now then it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but how to perform that which is

good I find not. For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do. Now if I do that I would not, it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me. I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with me. For I delight in the law of God after the inward man: But I see another law in my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members. O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death? I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin" (Rom 7:14-25).

Do we realize we are in a fight for eternal life? Can we get rid of the lethargy that is characteristic of our times? Can we see the goal before us? I Tim. 6:12). Is God's admonishment to us. "Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life" being done in our life?"
